





Dominican Republic occupies the eastern two-thirds of the large island of Hispaniola, which it shares with the Republic of Haiti, and is the second largest country in the Caribbean, comprising an area of 19,292 square miles (49,967 square kilometers). The country has a population of 10.5 million and enjoys sunny tropical weather all year. The average year-round temperatures are 78°F to 88°F (25°C to 31°C). The cooler season is November through April, while it is warmest from May through October.

TIME: The local time zone is Eastern Caribbean Time (GMT-0400). The Dominican Republic does not observe daylight savings time.

CAPITAL CITY: The Dominican Republic's historic and sophisticated capital city, Santo Domingo, is the oldest city of the New World. Santo Domingo's Colonial City was declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1990.

LANGUAGE: Spanish is the official language; however, most employees in hotels and tourist destinations speak relatively good English, French, German, and Italian, among other languages.

CURRENCY: The Dominican peso (RD\$) is the official currency.

GETTING HERE: Dominican Republic currently has eight international airports throughout the country, including: Las Américas International Airport (SDQ) in Santo Domingo, Punta Cana International Airport (PUJ), La Romana International Airport (LRM), Gregorio Luperón International Airport (POP) in Puerto Plata, El Cibao International Airport (STI) in Santiago, and El Catey International Airport (AZS) in Samaná. Maritime ports that regularly receive cruise ships in the country include Santo Domingo Port (Sans Souci and Don Diego terminals), La Romana Port (east and west docks, Catalina Island and Casa de Campo Marina) Punta Cana (Cap Cana Marina), Puerto Plata (Amber Cove) and Samaná Bay facilities (Cayo Levantado).

DOCUMENTATION: Most visitors arriving in the Dominican Republic-including those from the United States, Canada, United Kingdom, the European Union, Mexico, many South American countries and Central America (see the full list of countries on our website)-only need a passport with a minimum validity equivalent to the duration of their stay to enter the country. The cost of the 30-day tourist card, paid separately in the past, is now included in the airline ticket for all visitors.

VISAS: Any person, regardless of their nationality, can visit Dominican Republic if they are a legal resident of, or if they have one of the following valid visas in their passport: United States, Canada, United Kingdom or Schengen. Travelers who do not have a passport or visa from countries listed above will need to apply for a visa. To issue a visa, the passport needs to have a validity of at least six (6) months. ELECTRICITY: Sockets operate at 110 Volts/60 Hertz, the same as North America. If needed, adapter plugs are available at most hotels.

TAXES: Dominican hotels and restaurants collect an additional 28 percent of their published prices (18 percent sales tax + 10 percent service charge).

MEDICAL PRECAUTIONS: Due to the strength of the Caribbean sun and the climatic conditions of the area, it is recommended that vacationers always wear sunscreen and mosquito repellent when outdoors and drink filtered water throughout the day to avoid dehydration. DRINKING AGE: The legal drinking age in the country is 18 years old.

LOCAL TRANSPORT

As the second largest country in the Caribbean, Dominican Republic offers a wide range of activities which can be a short or long distance away from one another. Many options exist for traveling on well-maintained highways to nearby attractions and also to more distantly located excursions.

GROUND TRANSPORT: Taxis are available at most hotels and tour operators are more than willing to provide additional options for getting around. Visitors should also check with their hotel for any recommendations.

BUSES: Air conditioned motor coaches and vans arranged by local tour operators are available from most hotels. Also, daily service is available between Punta Cana/Bávaro and Santo Domingo with the company Expreso Bávaro. www.expresobavaro.com

CAR RENTALS: Car rental offices and facilities can be found at the airports. Renters must be 25 with a valid driver's license.

AIRPORT: Punta Cana International Airport (PUJ), the country's largest and most popular airport, serves the Punta Cana and Bávaro regions. Many hotels are only a 10 – 35 minute taxi ride from the airport. www.puntacanainternationalairport.com





The main draw to the luxurious and exotic area of Punta Cana are the pristine beaches that stretch more than 40 miles (64 kilometers) and border the meeting point between the Atlantic Ocean and the Caribbean Sea. The multi-shaded blue waters are complemented by pristine white sands and create lasting impressions for all beach goers.

PUNTA CANA BEACH: Punta Cana is any beach lover's dream with its glorious white sand lined with palms and lapped by turquoise waters. Punta Cana's sands stretch for 3 miles (4.8 kilometers) of the best beaches of the region.

PLAYA BLANCA: This beach is part of Puntacana Resort & Club's gated community, but admission is free. You can visit the popular Playa Blanca Restaurant or book kitesurfing lessons at The Kite Club. For those looking to brush up on their skills, professional kitesurfing and SUP surfing instruction is offered

at this extensive white sand beach by certified Puntacana Resort & Club staff.

PLAYA JUANILLO: Juanillo at Cap Cana offers miles of pristine, white sand beaches with turquoise waters so clear that it is often referred to one of the best beaches in Dominican Republic. A wide selection of tropical food and drinks and formal events and concerts are available at Juanillo as well as beach activities such as volleyball, snorkeling, kite surfing, and kayaking.

CABEZA DE TORO BEACH: Cabeza de Toro Beach's "Blue Flag" European certification guarantees that the beach is always in fantastic shape and therefore is a popular beach for tourists. Cabeza de Toro Yacht Club is a departure point for fishing trips and fishing tournament sites.

PLAYA BÁVARO: This beach has the European certification "Blue Flag". The most developed section of the East Coast resort strip, Bávaro, is dotted with hotels, restaurants and gift shops right on the beach. The area is one strip of sparkling white sand that extends 30 miles (48 kilometers) surrounded by coral reefs. Most of this stretch of beach is walkable and is the perfect place to book beach activities, ranging from parasailing to speed-boat riding.

PLAYA UVERO ALTO: Located at the northern-most end of Punta Cana, this fine bronze-colored sand beach allows you to either enjoy open areas with large waves or calm waters protected by reefs, depending on the part of the beach you visit. This beach has the European certification "Blue Flag".

PLAYA MACAO: Declared by UNESCO as one of the best beaches in the Caribbean, Macao is a public beach located 20 to 30 minutes away from most hotels. Surfing classes are available if the conditions are appropriate and various shacks serving refreshments and food can be found along the beach.

PLAYA EL CORTECITO-LOS CORALES: With no access restrictions, El Cortecito Beach and Los Corales, in the heart of Bávaro, is like a small fisherman's village where you will find beautiful beaches, restaurants, bars, supermarkets, shopping centers and many gift and craft shops nearby. Like Playa Bávaro and Playa Macao, this beach has the European certification "Blue Flag" and many sea excursions depart from this beach.

PLAYA ARENA GORDA: Another east coast beach proudly holding Blue Flag certification status, Playa Arena Gorda is flanked on either side by all-inclusive resorts. Its thick, white sands and turquoise waters make it a favorite spot for long walks, swimming, or simply lounging on the sand all day. Lifeguards are present in the area, and you'll find an onsite restaurant for snack breaks.



ATTRACTIONS

CAP CANA HARBOR & MARINA: The largest world-class marina in the Caribbean, Cap Cana Harbor & Marina is designed to be the most advanced and modern marina in the area where just beyond the docks you can experience some of the best angling in the Caribbean. In addition to its luxury transportation amenities, the marina is equipped with meteorological buoyancy services unique to the Caribbean. When operating, the buoy measures wind and sea conditions, which are transmitted to the crews. Other facilities include government authorities such as harbor officials and customs departments, wireless internet and courtesy shuttle services. It hosts major international sport fishing tournaments. www.capcana.com

PUNTACANA RESORT & CLUB MARINA: The full-service marina is located at the Puntacana Resort & Club. With two docks and mooring for 43 yachts up to 70-feet (21 meters) LOA, the marina is well-liked by big game fishermen and is one of the

most popular areas to hold billfish tournaments in Dominican Republic. The established marina includes a swimming pool, restaurant, cable television, telephone, laundry facilities, ice bags and drinking water. www.puntacana.com

INDIGENOUS EYES ECOLOGICAL PARK: The southern end of Punta Cana harbors more than 500 species of exotic plants and trails that snake along 12 natural lagoons, each with a unique name from the native Taino language. The park has 1,500 acres (600 hectares) set aside as conservation land and is owned and managed by the Puntacana Ecological Foundation. The reserve is also categorized as a "transition zone sub-tropical forest" due to the flora and fauna exhibiting characteristics of both the dry and humid sub-tropical forests. The Park is open daily to the public from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and offers tours with tour guides. www.puntacana.org



DOLPHIN ISLAND PARK: Located between the beach and coral barrier of Bávaro, Dolphin Island Park takes visitors swimming with the delicate and graceful sea animals in the midst of their natural habitat. Trained professionals boat visitors out to a platform where they can snorkel, swim and take pictures with dolphins, stingrays and sea lions. www.dolphinislandpark.com


MANATÍ PARK: Tropical birds, reptiles and animal entertainment shows are dispersed throughout this 80-square-mile (210-square kilometer) attraction, centered in magnificent gardens abundant with orchids and tropical plants. The park and its exhibits feature an insight into Dominican culture, folklore and artistry of the Taino Indians, the island's inhabitants at the time of the Spanish conquest. Children can also approach animals and have a personal relationship with some of the most intriguing creatures such as dolphins and non-venomous snakes. www.manatipark.com

MARINARIUM: The Marinarium is the perfect tour for lovers of the wonders hidden in the marine world. It is an experience that allows you to enjoy and rediscover the beauty of coral reefs, as well as swimming with nurse sharks and stingrays. SEAQUARIUM: This underwater walking adventure tour lets visitors get up close and personal with sea creatures. Discover colorful tropical fish, friendly sting rays, amazing corals, sunken objects and more with the help of a guide, special breathing helmet and your own two feet. www.seaquariumpuntacana.com

SCUBA DIVING: Conditions for diving in Punta Cana are often difficult due to strong currents, the open sea and the unprotected coastline; as a result, there are few coral reef habitats. For experienced divers, it is still an area of interest with impressive walls, white sandy sea bottoms, rays and schools of fish. Also it is home to the remains of several ships, some sunk by hurricane winds, others intentionally to create new marine habitats, and an underwater museum featuring over 20 sculptures representing Dominican Republic's indigenous legacy, created by the award-winning artist Thimo Pimentel.





BÁVARO ADVENTURE PARK: Ideal for those seeking an adrenaline rush, Bávaro Adventure Park offers nature-friendly and sustainable activities such as ziplining, a climbing garden, a Segway circuit, paintball, a bungee trampoline, a Jurassic Park and if you want to fly, a flight simulator takes you to the sky to enjoy a panoramic view of 360 degrees. Discover spectacular sunken pirate ships and so much more! The park operates to meet world-class standards and provides guests with knowledgeable international and multilingual staff, each with the proper certification. Bávaro Adventure Park is located near the hotel zone of Bávaro and Punta Cana and opens every day from 8:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. www.bavaroadventurepark.com

SCAPE PARK: Located at world-class Cap Cana, Scape Park includes the top tourist, athletic, cultural and entertainment activities within the property. The area's design and architecture create a versatile array of landscapes that provide attractions for travelers of all ages. Activities here include a zipline ecotour, adventure buggies, Hoyo Azul Natural Lagoon, Las Ondas cenote, water activities, horseback riding and more. The park's latest attraction, the Cave Expedition, takes visitors on a hike up the El Farallon Cliff and into the vast underground network of chambers and tunnels below. AQUA PARK: This water sports park delivers fun for all ages around a large, beautiful natural lake in Bávaro. It's the perfect spot for families with kids of all ages. Teens can enjoy a hands-on introductory wakeboard lessons in "Wake Lake" and the little ones can splash around for supervised fun in "Play Lake." Groups can purchase day or half day passes which both include transportation to and from the park. www.aquaparkdr.com

DEEP-SEA FISHING: The waters around Punta Cana and Bávaro feature some of the best places in the world for sport fishing and they are catalogued as among the five best areas for fishing for billfish and marlin. This is why the annual tournaments attract international participants during the summer months. In late October, the waters are sufficiently calm for fishing for mahi-mahi, mackerel, swordfish, blue marlin, barracuda, sea bream, and many more.


SPAS: Whether it is for a girlfriend getaway, a romantic trip for two or a stress-relief holiday from the hustle and bustle, a visit to Punta Cana, Cap Cana and Bávaro's all-inclusive resorts and spa facilities is an ideal way to decompress. The world-class properties specialize in some of today's hottest and most luxurious spa services.

SHOPPING: Visitors can embrace the lifestyle of the rich and famous in Punta Cana or seek out Dominican Republic souvenirs at local shops. Upscale boutiques can be found at places like Puntacana Village, Blue Mall, Palma Real Shopping Village and San Juan Shopping Center, while local vendors and shops can be found scattered along beaches, such as Plaza Bibijagua at Bávaro Beach. Traditional Dominican products like amber, larimar, ceramic dolls, handmade wooden fish with recycled parts, chocolate, coffee, rum, cigars, macadamia nuts, merengue music and more can be bought from these local stands.

NIGHTLIFE: Effervescent nightlife and world-class gambling can be found at most resorts throughout the region, and are a great way to unwind after a day filled with adventure. You can experience the nightlife of Punta Cana like a local at one of many discos and nightspots, such as Oro, and Kviar. Enjoy an evening visiting the internationally famous Coco Bongo. Also at the Puntacana Village, and in Sanctuary Town in Cap Cana, you can find a large variety of bars and restaurants, which can be lively or laid back to suit your style. Partygoers can also enjoy a mystical night of dancing and animation in an unparalleled location at Imagine Nightclub, a club dispersed throughout a network of caves spanning 115,500 feet (35,000 meters).

RESTAURANTS: Punta Cana offers a wide selection of restaurants ranging from family-friendly to romantic, many of them by the beach. Popular options include Poseidón, La Yola, Little John, Playa Blanca, Capitán Cook, Jellyfish, Huracán Café, and Noah among others, as well as a variety of places to enjoy at the Puntacana Village, Sanctuary Town and Blue Mall with the new and popular Bachata Rosa restaurant. This interesting restaurant and pop music bar present a diverse menu with Dominican and international fusions and with a decoration that reflects the themes of the songs of one of its owners, the famous Dominican singer and Grammy Award winner, Juan Luis Guerra.





HIGÜEY: Located less than an hour away from the resort area, Higüey was founded in 1494 by Spanish colonist Juan de Esquivela. A city deep in history, Higüey was originally one of the Taino Kingdoms that occupied the land and is a great way to better understand the Dominican way of life. However, it is now a bustling and fun city. In its streets buildings and houses of Victorian and modern styles predominate. Higüey is home to the Cathedral Basilica Our Lady of Altagracia, Patroness of the Dominican Republic, as well as the Basilica Museum that reflects the Catholic history and cultural expressions of the Dominican people in their piety to the Virgin Mary. The museum is open from Tuesday to Sunday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

BOCA DE YUMA: Situated an hour southwest of Punta Cana, this hidden paradise remains a humble village surrounded by beautiful beaches. Boca de Yuma is an authentic fishing village that used to be a favorite hangout for pirates, most notably Roberto Cofresí. High coral bluffs surround the bay that is home to a fleet of small colorful fishing boats and wildlife such as iguanas, pelicans and seabirds.

INLAND SAFARIS: Jeep, truck and 8-wheel military truck in-country safari tours are offered at all resort hotels. These high vehicles take you inland across rivers and rough terrain using one of several routes, usually traveling through jungles and sugarcane plantations, stopping for a refreshing swim in a river or at an unspoiled beach, enjoying a Dominican food buffet, listening to typical "perico ripiao" music, visiting a small village with a stopover at the local "colmado" (grocery store), and taking an inside peek into a country home for a cup of home-brewed Dominican coffee.

CARIBBEAN PIRATES: The perfect show for the whole family, Pirates of the Caribbean style. Enter an authentic pirate village, board the pirate vessel, and celebrate with a spectacular feast and a pirate toast with rum. Transportation
